



- 2] Jesus responds by offering at least four reasons to be attracted to follow Him in vv. 62-68. How do you understand each of these reasons to be attracted:
- a] "Son of Man will ascend to where He was before" [v. 62].
  - b] "The Spirit gives life; the flesh counts for nothing. The words I have spoken to you are full of the Spirit and life." [v. 63]
  - c] "No one can come to me unless the Father has enabled them." [v. 65]
  - d] "Lord, to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life. We have come to believe and to know that you are the Holy One of God." [Vv. 68-69]
- 3] Both Peter and Judas were members of Jesus' inner circle, part of the Twelve, at the core of the church. What do the two men have in common? What is different about them?

**Work it Through**

- 4] As many disciples got to know Jesus better, they didn't like what they saw and lost interest in following Him [v. 66]. Certainly Judas is in this group. Though he stayed very involved with Jesus and the church [he was treasurer of the Twelve]! When are you tempted to join that group?
- 5] What motivates *you* to follow Jesus instead?

6] Scott used the illustration of Google Maps, urging us to Start from your *Current Location*” to get to our destination of *Home*. The map makes a route from wherever we start.

Our destination is *Home* with the Father. Our *route* is follow Jesus. Do not wait to get your act together before deciding to follow Jesus. Start here. Start now. Under *Get Directions*, what is your next turn or next step? What will you Stop? Start? How will it shape your schedule? Relationships? Money?
