TRANSFORMING Your Family

HOW TO RAISE AMAZING KIDS BILL HASLIM JANUARY 17-18, 2015

Opening Remarks

When you first become a parent you enter with excitement, optimism, and overwhelming care into the world of responsibility for another life. And from day one, new parents are inundated by countless sources of advice and guidance on how best to raise their kids. And then as your kid grows and enters the school system and the world of sports and other extracurricular activities, there are suddenly more measures of your kid's performance than you would ever want. Surrounded by so many opinions of how you should be raising your child and so many measures of success for your child to hit or miss, it's easy to lose focus on the simple truth that God too cares deeply about how we raise our kids. And God's vision for what matters most in how we raise our kids might look quite different than the vision of the culture around us. God is calling us together –not just as parents but as His church family- to raise amazing godly kids according to the principals and priorities shown to us in the gospel of Jesus Christ. In our role as parents and in our role as a church we want to raise amazing kids –godly kids- but it's one of the most difficult and overwhelming tasks we've been given.

- 2.] How would you say raising kids has become more difficult for parents over the past few decades?

Talk it over

- 3.] Look over each of the following passages in search of clues that answer this one question: What matters most to God for our kids?

- 1 Samuel 16:7
- Deuteronomy 6:4-9
- Mark 8:36
- Matthew 6:33
- Luke 10:38-42

Work it out

- 4.] How does God want to refocus our vision for how we are raising our kids?
- 5.] What would Jesus say needs to become a greater priority for your kid or for kids in our community?
- 6.] How do we as adults or parents help kids embrace biblical priorities when some of those priorities are so contrary to the priorities of most of their peers?
- 7.] In our kids' worlds, where do you see the URGENT overshadowing the ETERNAL?
- 8.] How much margin do you have to be relationally available for kids?
- 9.] What is one change that could help to slow down your kid or kids you know?

Wrap it up

10.] As you reflect on this entire topic, what gives you hope and what provokes fear and concern? Remember that none of us gets to be a perfect parent. Remember also that no matter what we get right in our parenting or shepherding of kids, they will still make their own mistakes beyond our control. The good news for us is that God is their greater parent and He loves them more perfectly and powerfully than we ever could.

Read Philippians 4:6-7 and respond in prayer: Pray not only for the needs of our kids and families, but also for the gift of Christ's peace for every parent.
