 - 2. READ John 10:12-15
 - a. Who do you think is represented as "the hired hand"? Why is it important that the shepherd *knows* his flock?
 - 3. READ John 10:16-18
 - a. Who are the other sheep?
 - b. Look at verse 18 and discuss why can Jesus can make such a bold statement.

- 4. READ Ezekiel 34:7-16
 - a. God promises to take over as shepherd of His scattered flock. What promises to you see in these verses?
- 5. READ Ezekiel 34:23-24
 - a. Who is God going to send? Do these verses comfort you? If so, how?

CHALLENGE

What areas of your life are you struggling to trust Jesus as a Good Shepherd? This week, spend some time reflecting on how Jesus knows you, cares for you and laid down His life for you.
