Name of the Game: Warm Fuzzies

**Needed:** A piece of paper or white board to keep tally during the game **How to Play:** This game can last a day, a week, or all month...you get to decide as a family. The goal is to have the most "Warm Fuzzies" by the end of the game period. Throughout the duration of the game, every time someone in the family has a positive or HOPEFUL attitude, be the first person to yell out and say, "OH, THAT GIVES ME WARM FUZZIES!" ## Think about It

Hope is a feeling of desire for a certain thing to happen. Hope creates a positive attitude toward the future. When we have God on our side, we can have the best type of hope - a positive expectation that what we hope for will really happen. God gives us confident hope when we are hoping for good things.

It's no fun to be around someone who always expects the worst to happen. They are always complaining or expecting bad things. You may hear them say things like, "We will probably lose the game because the other team is bigger than us." However, a hopeful mindset will say, "Yes, they are bigger than us, but so was Goliath and God helped David beat him." A negative mindset says, "School is going to be so hard because I have a test today," but a hopeful mindset says, "I studied for this test and I'm going to do my best and I know that it's going to be a great day no matter what."

What kind of mindset do you have? Do you assume the worst, or do you have a positive, hopefully mindset?

## Make it count!

As we read the Bible, we see that the world needed a Savior. The people were hopeful that a Savior would come because God promised it. They didn't know when or how He would arrive, but they were full of HOPE. God fulfilled his promise when He sent Jesus. The people were so happy. However, when Jesus died on the cross, it was really hard for the people to hold on to the HOPE that Jesus brought them because they were so sad. They forgot that Jesus said he wasn't going to stay dead. Then after three days, Jesus rose from the dead!

Sometimes, when things are difficult, we forget that we can have HOPE in Jesus...no matter what! When you are having trouble being hopeful, read God's Word, pray, and talk to positive, hope-filled people. Memorize this month's victory verse – it will help remind you that we can have great HOPE and expect great things because we trust God, the source of the greatest hope!
