Most all of us have said *The Lord's Prayer* before. But do we really know what we are saying? In this week's message, we look at verse 10, **Your kingdom come, Your will be done on earth as it is in heaven.**

READING:

Read out loud together - Matthew 6:9-13.

Our Father in heaven, hallowed be Your name.

Your kingdom come

Your will be done

On earth as it is in heaven.

Give us this day our daily bread.

And forgive us our debts,

As we forgive our debtors.

And do not lead us into temptation,

But deliver us from the evil one.

Big Idea: Lord make us a people of extraordinary prayer.

DISCUSS WITH THE GROUP:

"When you pray Thy kingdom come, Thy will be done," you are praying that you may do diligently what He commands, and submit patiently to what He inflicts."-Thomas Watson

DISCUSSION QUESTION:

1. What do you think of when you hear "Your kingdom come, your will be done, on earth as it is in heaven"?

WHY IS THIS SO HARD?

Tyler gives us 2 reasons it is so hard for us to build HIS kingdom instead of our own.

1) You are so good at building your own kingdom; 2) You don't really want to be ruled over by God. What do these two statements trigger in you? Why?

"This is a prayer of submission, in a posture of surrender, that leads to a place of discipleship."-Pastor Ranjit David

DISCUSSION QUESTION:

2. Why is it hard for you to put God's kingdom and God's will before your kingdom and your will?

WHY IS THIS SO IMPORTANT? - It's the heart of the gospel.

- READ John 3:16-18. What is the heart of the gospel?
- Jesus knew how important God's will is over His own. READ Matthew 26:39 & 42.
- Why is building God's kingdom better than building our own?

HOW DO WE DO IT?

- Pray the scriptures.
- Memorize scripture.
- Intentionally focus on Jesus.

DISCUSSION QUESTION:

3. What is one way you feel God is leading you to surrender to His will in your life?

GOING DEEPER:

- Here are a few scriptures you may wish to memorize and pray. Look up each passage and discuss what they mean to you.
- Hebrews 12:2-3 - Matthew 6:33 - Proverbs 3:5-6 - Psalm 105:4.
- What is your favorite passage of scripture? Why?

COMMIT TO MEMORY:

Throughout this series, commit to memory The Lord's Prayer in Matthew 6:9-13.
